My principal research interests revolve around applied micro-econometric methods, educational and cultural stratification, reading and intergenerational transmissions. In my Ph.D. project, I used econometric methods to analyze the relationship between family background, cultural inputs and children's reading. I currently work on two research projects. In the first, I use individual level library data for the entire population of Denmark to study local variation in library inequality, elite literary tastes, the impact of initiatives to increase families use of children's libraries, the impact of (good and bad) newspaper reviews etc. In the second, I use Danish registry data to study the impact of injuries (e.g. minor head injuries) on children's educational outcomes and criminal behavior including how effects might spillover to parents or siblings.
