


Settlement in Denmark

- from a 35-year perspective

Is there a greater tendency today than previously among high-income individuals to congregate in specific residential areas? Are people on lower incomes more likely to live in areas separated from the other income groups today? Are non-Western immigrants and their descendants more likely to separate themselves physically from people of Danish origin today? The book answers these questions by describing developments in the residential segregation of different population groups in Denmark over the past 35 years, taking as its base existing knowledge about housing markets such as the Danish one.






An ageing Denmark

Danish people are living longer and longer, and combined with several years of falling birth rates, the proportion of elderly people – including the share of extremely old people – is rising, both in absolute figures and relatively as a proportion of the entire population. It cannot be denied that a rising life expectancy is a welfare benefit, but ageing also entails loss of functionality – with the associated challenges.

In the book, a series of researchers take an inter-scientific approach to analysing the scope of the demographic changes and the individual and societal consequences.

Welfare state and population in Denmark, Germany and the UK

The book sketches the development of the welfare states in Denmark, the UK and Germany since 1960, and takes a look at their current status. The book also presents an overview of the everyday lives and living conditions of the Danish, British and German people at home and on the labour market, in education institutions and in public life.

This book is the second volume in a series that takes a comparative view of the welfare states of Northern Europe.


NExTWORK

A network-based, company-centric initiative for young people NExTWORK is a long-term investment with the objective of helping the most vulnerable unemployed young people to start a job or a course of education – and to see it through.

NExTWORK is deployed at municipal level and has been implemented in the Municipalities of Roskilde, Horsens and Sønderborg. The Municipalities of Vejle and Kalundborg, and the City of Copenhagen have also completed a NExTWORK process.


